AUTHORIZATION TO THE CLERK TO SIGN CERTAIN ORDERS

ORDER _#101_

Pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. §956, in connection with cases and proceedings commenced under the Bankruptcy Code, and in connection with cases pending or reopened under the Bankruptcy Code, this Court hereby authorizes the Bankruptcy Clerk to sign and enter the following orders which are deemed to be of ministerial nature:

- 1. Orders and notices that establish meeting and hearing dates required by law under Title 11 or requested by a party in interest, including orders which fix the last dates for filing: objections to discharge, objections to confirmation of plans, and objections to proofs of claim.
 - 2. Orders closing cases and discharging the trustee.
- 3. Orders permitting the payment of filing fees in installments and fixing the number, amount and date of payment of each installment. Any request for an extension of time greater than the four month period, or a request which is received after entry of the first order entered by the clerk, shall be in writing and will be considered only by a judge.
- 4. Debtor requested orders to employers of debtors in chapter 13 cases directing payment of all or a portion of a debtor's wages and orders to debtors directing payment from future income to the chapter 13 trustee in furtherance of a proposed or confirmed chapter 13 plan.
- 5. Orders for payment of dividends in a chapter 7 case following the court's approval of the trustee's final account.
- 6. Orders in chapter 7 cases requiring the production and delivery of income tax returns and refunds to the trustee, upon the application of the trustee.

- 7. Discharge of Debtor in a case in which there has not been timely filed an objection to discharge of the debtor. Discharges granted by the court following trial on objections thereto will be signed only by the judge.
 - 8. Orders authorizing assignment of claims.
