The Judiciary Appropriations Act of 1991 authorized the Judicial Conference of the United States to prescribe reasonable fees pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1930 for usage of public access to bankruptcy court data. The Judicial Conference has instituted a schedule of fees which provides for charges for using electronic access to court data including access through PACER.

The Conference authorizes the Bankruptcy Court to exempt persons or classes of persons from the fees in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to such information. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that usage of PACER terminals in the public areas of the offices of the clerk in Cedar Rapids and Sioux City are exempt from the per minute usage fee established by the Judicial Conference.

IT IS ORDERED that individual case trustees and standing trustees are exempt from the per minute usage fee. Trustees who are practicing attorneys, to take advantage of exempt use, must establish a trustee's exempt access account which may be used only for work done in the individual's capacity as a trustee.
